	History of Bengal(c.1905-1947)	DSE –A1	The focus of this paper deals with Bengal.the rise of British ,their administration,political and educational system and reforms as well as remains questions partaing to Bengal.
	History of Modern East Asia (c.1868-1945)	DSE B1	This paper is elaborately discouses the evolution of the chinies empair,various revolution and its effects on traditional socity and economy and finally the Rise of The Republic Of Chaina.
